COR Certificates Now Paperless- Effective February 28, 2022

Employers now have access to a PDF file of their Certificate of Recognition (COR)!

No more waiting for the mail. Employers can access and print their own certificate through their myWCB account with the Workers' Compensation Board – Alberta. This is the same location where you can print your Partnerships in Injury Reduction reports. To download or print your COR certificate, just log into your myWCB account and click on Reports and Invoices. If you need assistance accessing your myWCB account, contact the eBusiness Support Team at 1-866-922-9221.

This new service significantly decreases red tape and increases efficiency by reducing turnaround time for a COR to reach its employer. As soon as your COR is approved, you can access it.

Partnership Standards Updates

- Standard 1.15 – Auditor Notes
 - Additional clarity was added regarding quantification for audit questions that require the percentage of positive indicators to be reported.
 - For questions that require a percentage of positive indicators for scoring, include quantification (e.g. 8/12) to support the note (e.g. cascade questions for hazard assessment, etc.).

Criteria for Determining Representative Work Site Sampling

- The site sampling requirements were simplified and the main office only must be included in certification/recertification years.
